










### Unemployment rate 15-64 years (2024)

### Labour market characteristics





Service-based economy with companies in the transport and communication, finance and distribution/retail sectors.



A majority of small and medium-sized enterprises (SME): 8 out of 10 companies have less than 10 workers



High rate of vacant positions (highest in the EU with the Netherlands)



High number of labour shortages



High degree of mobility of workers between the 3 regions and with neighbouring countries (Luxembourg, the Netherlands, France and Germany)



High number of permanent contracts







# Working conditions in Belgium





### Working conditions in Belgium

EUROPEAN JOB DAYS

#### Working hours and leave

- 38 hours/week
- 20 paid leave/year minimum

#### **Salary**

- Collective bargaining agreements (basic rates and index-linked increases)
- Holiday pay and optional end-of-year bonus
- Minimum monthly salary:

2111.89€ gross\* or about 2001€ net

Average monthly salary:

4076€ gross\* or about 2625€ net

#### How to calculate your net salary?

**GROSS SALARY** 

- 13, 07% Social Security contributions

= TAXABLE SALARY

Withholding Tax

+/- Miscellaneous (travel expenses, meal vouchers)

= NET SALARY






### Key sectors and labour shortages

#### Vacant positions in Wallonia (4th quarter 2024)



- 6 sectors account for 3/4 of all jobs
- 162 critical or shortage occupations
- 50% of shortage occupations in construction and industry

# Check if a recognition of your qualifications is needed

- Depends on the region of work
- Regulated professions may vary from region to region
- List of regulated professions on EU regulated professions database
- Recognition of qualifications mandatory to work in the public sector

### How to look for a job in Belgium?





Always apply in the language of the job offer or the region that you target!





### Tips for your CV and your cover letter

EUROPEAN JOB DAYS



2 pages maximum for your CV if you have long years of experience



1 page maximum for your cover letter



Sensitive personal information must be left out (date of birth, age, marital status, kids, religion, etc.)



Chose the appropriate contact details (email, phone number, social media profiles, personal website...?)



Use reversed chronology in your CV: from most recent to oldest experiences and diplomas



Don't forget to take care of the design and layout!



Match your vocabulary and the language with the job offer



A short introduction in the CV is appreciated and gives a personal touch





### Tips for the interview





Make sure you know how the interview will take place and that you have the right setting (if not on site)



Get as many information as possible on the company and its ongoing projects beforehand



Have a short introduction about yourself, your experience related to the job and your objectives ready



Select examples of real situations where you had to use the competencies requested for the position



Prepare a list of question related to your future responsibilities and to the organisation of work



Don't forget: everyone loves a dialogue, "thank you" and next steps!
