# The German labour market Germany is looking for skilled workers

- Largest economy in the European Union (EU) and - after the USA, China - the world's third largest economy (gross domestic product)
- Germany is also the third-largest exporting country
- Strong automotive, chemical and electronic sectors (Volkswagen, Daimler, BMW, BASF (chemicals) and Siemens (electronics) are the main global players
- 55.1% of the total workforce in Germany works in small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs)
- Unemployment rate 6% (Bavaria lowest rate)
- Approximately 700.000 reported vacancies







- Location of large international companies such as Telekom, Cisco, Siemens, IBM, SAP, Oracle, Microsoft, eBay
- Thanks to <u>international recruiting</u>, IT positions in Berlin are nevertheless filled more quickly than in other federal states.

# **Recognition of foreign degrees**



## Recognition of foreign degrees



Recognition is required to work in regulated professions in German

Regulated professions are legally protected occupations

A foreign professional qualification is recognised if it is equivilant to a German qualification

An official notice will confirm whether the qualification is recognised in Germany after the process is completed

The recognistion procedure for professional qualifications must be completed

## **Targeted Mobility Scheme Requirements**



Age between 18 and retirement age (in the country of destination)




Interest in a job or apprenticeship subject to:

- -- social security contributions
- •- complies with legal and collective agreement provisions
- •- has a duration of at least six months, or three months in the case of internships, and
- •- the working time is at least 50% of a full-time position.

You are advised by the Federal Employment Agency or a EURES Adviser and the advisory has been verifiably taken place prior to submitting the application.

# Targeted Mobility Scheme Main Benefits

- Travel costs: You can apply for a one-off financial support for your travel costs before your interview.
- Relocation costs: After a successful placement, you can apply for one-off financial support for relocation before your move.
- Recognition costs: You can apply for financial support for the recognition of academic and professional qualifications.
- Language course in the country of origin: You can apply for financial support for a preparatory language course in the country of origin
- Language course in the country of destination: You can apply for support for an employment related (part-time) language course in the country of destination, provided you are released from work for this.









